

Aitchison's Wideline Cultivators are back

NEW Zealand manufacturer Aitchison is again making cultivators. "About six years ago, Aitchison decided to take the Wideline Cultivators® off the market because power harrows were becoming increasingly popular. However, over the last couple of seasons, we have seen increased demand for these machines again as people realise how destructive power harrows can be to the soil structure," according to Ross Maxwell of Reese Agri.

Aitchison Cultivators have always had a great following and some customers wouldn't take "no" for an answer when told they were off the menu.

"Last year, we received orders when the word spread that we would possibly produce these machines again; this more or less forced our hand."

A heavy frame and tines, road legal transport width and superior angled crumbler rollers make for a well finished quality machine.

Prices start at \$39,000 for the 6.85m wide model.

The Aitchison Earthquaker® has been produced by the company for many years alongside heavy duty rippers.

The Earthquaker® uses high tensile steel to create a refined piece of machinery with maximum underground but minimum aboveground disturbance.

Slender, high tensile bissalloy legs and wings create a "wave" movement in the paddock effectively breaking up the pan while your pasture stays intact. The machines come standard with coulter discs and an optional steel roller.

"The invigorated grass growth after usage makes for a quick payback, especially when considering you can own an Earthquaker for as little as \$5750 plus GST," says Mr Maxwell.
